

### **Religious Affiliation Among Seniors**

- \* 29% of the care givers to our senior population young adults between ages 25-44 have no religious affiliation
- They are serving the needs of senior adults (ages 65 and older) – 88% of these seniors DO have a religious affiliation – the most religious age group in Canada

Religions Affiliation is declining but still very prevalent among elders






