As a service of **BC Care Providers Association** and **EngAge BC**, we are pleased to bring you our inaugural weekly **MLA Update** during the COVID-19 pandemic crisis. Our seniors care providers today represent the frontline in the battle against the coronavirus, and we want to keep you posted on what is happening.

Among the many steps we have taken since last month is to schedule thrice weekly calls between our organization, other sector representatives, and leadership at the Ministry of Health. Through these meetings, BCCPA advocated for ending non-essential visits to care homes to help prevent the spread of the virus. Soon after, BCCPA called for the ending multi-site employment, and for working with local health authorities to ensure workers are posted at a single care home during the pandemic.

We launched <u>Operation Canucks</u>, connecting over 75 out-of-work employees from Canucks Sports & Entertainment with available positions at care homes. We also worked hard alongside <u>SafeCare BC</u> to promote donations of PPE (personal protective equipment) for frontline staff through <u>Operation Protect</u>. Finally, BCCPA has fielded dozens of media inquiries throughout the pandemic, because keeping care providers, their staff and the public informed is vitally important during a crisis.



C.D.C. is expected to advise all Americans to wear cloth masks in public


The Trump administration is expected to announce as soon as Thursday that all Americans should wear cloth masks or other face coverings if they go out in public.







Snapshot of the long-term care, assisted living and independent living sites impacted by the coronavirus in B.C.
