



The baby boom.





Consequence: a long-lasting population bulge...






Statistics Canada: Table 17-10-0057-01, M1 scenario






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
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Summary of the data

• The baby boom: it was big!


• Lifespans: growing at about 1-2 months per year.

Consequence: large population bulge...and it's sticking around.





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
Health expenditures by age group:

+1.5 points (PBO) +3 points (C.D. Howe)




PBO Fiscal Sustainability Report

Projected provincial health expenditures:


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Starts picking up <u>now,</u>



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



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
