THE FACTS YOU AND YOUR LOVED ONES NEED TO KNOW

<u>Private Rooms</u>



O 87% of rooms in Residential Care are private rooms for one person.

9 out of 10 rooms in privately owned and operated care homes are private.

O Most newer care homes have **only** private and semi-private rooms.

O Single person rooms provide **privacy** but may increase **social isolation**.

<u>Semi-Private</u>



O 9% of rooms in Residential Care are semi-private rooms shared by two residents.

Two - Thirds of semi-private rooms O in British Columbia are found in privately owned and operated care homes.

O Semi-private rooms allow seniors the **flexibility** to live with a loved one, such as a spouse, or dear friend.





- O 4% of Rooms in Residential Care are multi-person rooms shared by 3 to 5 residents.
- Over 80% of multi-person rooms are found in government owned and operated care homes.
- O The average age of a care home with multi-person rooms is **41 years**.
- O Multi-person rooms can help combat **social-isolation**, but may lack **privacy**.

Facts & Figures on

SOCIAL ISOLATION · LONELINESS

- Nearly **one in four** seniors reported that they would like to participate more in social activities.
- O Social isolation and loneliness are associated with a higher risk of mortality in adults aged 52 and older
- O Increased loneliness can lead to **depression** as well as **cognitive decline** and increased risk of **dementia** among older adults.
- O Isolation is as strong a factor in early death as smoking **15 cigarettes a day.**
