

- Systemic issues affecting the welfare of seniors









• Ensure the protection and safety of seniors through the development of a provincial elder abuse prevention strategy









Expand Community Response Networks (SD) 2015

 \$1.4 M provided to BC Association of Community Response Networks to support coordinated local actions to prevent and respond to elder abuse and neglect over next three years





Expansion of Non-Medical Home Support Services (SD) 2015

Theme 5



Flexible Services



- \$15M to expand services in up to 60 communities over next three years
- Services launched in first 5 communities announced January



 Everyday supports to help seniors age in place (housekeeping, yard work, grocery shopping, etc.)







End of Life Care Training (PHC) April 2012

Theme 5



Flexible Services





- Training modules available for family physicians and home health teams to help strengthen end of life care
- Focus on improving advance care planning conversations and collaboration with specialists, patients, families and care givers







After-Hours Palliative Tele-Nursing Support (HCIC) April 2012

Flexible Services HealthLink BC nurses provide confidential information and advice

 Specialist palliative response nurses available to help callers with complex needs

• An independent review of the current program to examine how seniors' concerns and needs are being met and how seniors' can best be served

Safe Reporting (aka "whistleblowing") (PSQC) November 2012

• Improving the existing protections for patients and providers who report care concerns or complaints

Implementing Together to Reduce Elder Abuse Strategy (SD)

- Information kits being distributed
- Establish Council
- Inventory of existing training for health care professionals
- Phone line hours expanded by summer


