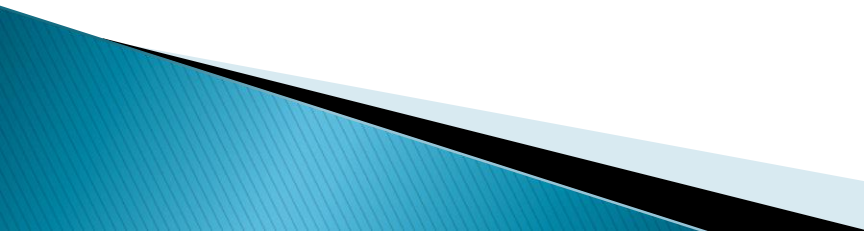
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# What is CSIL?

- ▶ CSIL is a direct funding model of self-managed home support for people with high physical care needs
- ▶ Designed to support people with significant physical disabilities to remain active participants in the community



# Who is eligible for CSIL?


- ▶ Eligible for Home & Community Care services
  - ▶ Assessed as having high physical care needs using RAI-HC
  - ▶ Ability to direct all details of care
  - ▶ Ability to provide an appropriate/safe working environment
  - ▶ Ability to be a good employer
  - ▶ Administrative abilities
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# Legal Representatives and Client Support Groups

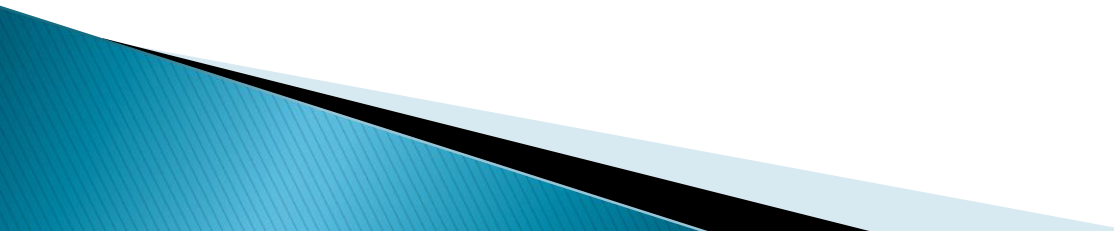
- ▶ For clients who are unable to direct their care or manage the administrative responsibilities
  - Legal Representative
  - Client support Group



# Pros

- ▶ Increased sense of control and independence
  - ▶ Design personal job descriptions based on activities, care needs, priorities, goals and values
  - ▶ Recruit, hire and train workers
  - ▶ Schedule workers to meet lifestyle, activities and care requirements
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# Cons

- ▶ Responsibilities as an employer (managing all aspects of care)
  - ▶ Need to learn new skills
  - ▶ Assume some personal risk by taking responsibility for care, services and staff
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# Being a CSIL Employer

- ▶ Similar to running a small business
  - Developing detailed care plan
  - Creating job descriptions
  - Recruiting, hiring, training, supervising and scheduling staff
  - Booking, payroll and monthly reports
